Detailed Itinerary: DAY 1: Arrival & Afternoon Ride

Morning departure from Montevideo, arriving in time for lunch at the ranch. Meet the charming couple who will host you. While the horses graze around you, settle into your accommodation. Time now to get to know your horse and, once comfortable, we head out to the forest then onto the beach.

This gentle introductory ride allows guests to get used to both the Uruguayan tack and also the horses -their amiability making them excellent partners for the diverse rides on the days ahead.

Dinner & Overnight at the Cabañas. L, D (approx. 3 hours riding)

DAY 2: Wetlands & Ombu Forest

An early start - after a delicious breakfast, we visit the UNESCO Biosphere Reserve. Crossing wetlands and pasturelands of working Estancias (farms) bordering the meandering Valizas River, we reach the second biggest coastal lagoon in Uruguay and where this river starts its life: Castillos Lagoon. After a gaucho style lunch under the great canopy of an Ombu tree – an ancient and unique botanical formation, quests can enjoy a siesta in a hammock or on the sheepskins off your saddle. In the afternoon, a different route takes us back to the Cabañas. These eastern Wetlands that we cross are home of hundreds of different birds, amphibians, fish and wild animals. Birds such as the large, flightless Rhea, the stunning pink Roseate Spoonbill and the South American screamer are frequently sighted. Capybaras (largest rodent in the world) and Armadillos can be spotted dashing back to their holes as we pass by. The graceful black-necked swan is often seen gliding across the lagoon.

Dinner & Overnight back at the Cabañas. *B*, *L*, *D* (approx. 4-5 hours riding)



DAY 3: Cabo Polonio Fishing Village & Sand Dunes.

The ride today starts with crossing the mouth of the Valizas River estuary at the point where the same river we followed to its source yesterday empties into the Atlantic Ocean. The tides will determine whether the horses are ridden across or towed by boat; an exciting start to a ride that takes us through a fascinating dune system of unexpected height (and now a national park) to Cabo Polonio -a fishing village turned 'low key' beach resort. The village is only accessible through these shifting sand dunes making it an intriguing outpost. A chance of a swim then lunch at a typical local beachfront restaurant with unbeatable views and fresh fish, seaweed and paella on the menu. Afternoon ride back to the Cabañas through pine forests, often observed by burrowing owls on their sand mounds; then along the riverbank watching the Cormorants fishing.

Dinner & Overnight back at the Cabañas. B, L, D (approx. 4-5 hours horse riding)



DAY 4: Hidden Lagoon & Unbeatable Viewpoint

For early risers, another chance of seeing the horses following the guide to the corral through the wetland just in front of your cabaña. In the morning we ride through a pine forest, a very enjoyable shady trail, until we reach a hidden lagoon. After a refreshing swim here, we continue to the beach for a long canter back home.Lunch at the Cabañas. In the afternoon we cross the Valizas River on horseback to once again enter the dune system, this time heading for the Buena Vista sand dune, the highest dune with an incredible 360° view. Coming back across the sand unes, we reach the Cabañas just on time for dinner and a chance to relax and watch the

DAY 5: Cattlework Gaucho Style & Swimming with Horses.

We start early in the morning, riding out across the pasturelands to meet the gaucho neighbour to 'help' him with his cattle.

This is your chance to find the inner Gaucho in you – combining all the skills polished over the last few days and your gaucho-bred horse will help you all the way. And as if this was not enough adrenaline for you (and the weather conditions allows it), another great adventure awaits: bareback riding and swimming with horses creating a truly memorable morning.

After lunch, departure. B, L (approx. 3 hours horse riding)

F.A.Q's

Horses & Tack: During this tour, riders usually stay with the same horse (as long as the rider is happy!). Our intention is for riders to build a bond with their horse and enjoy not only the landscape and ride but also the company of their horse! One or more spare horses will accompany us in case a change is needed. The horses are the local Uruguayan Criollo breed and criollo cross: ideally suited to the terrain. 'Criollo' is the horse breed in Uruguay, Argentina and the south of Brazil. The breed was developed from horses that were brought from Spain in the 17th century and then bred in this region. The Criollo is a strong horse with an excellent temperament (we will ask riders to complete a booking form to help us select horses for them). We use local saddles, a sort of flat 'western' type saddle (no pommel/horn) with a thick sheep skin atop. Neck reining is required (western 'one-hand' indirect rein riding) – people adapt very quickly but the quide and qauchos are on hand to give some advice. This tack is very suitable for long days in the saddle.

Accommodation: The accommodation is at a rural property set back from the beach where the horses are kept. There are currently two individual new 'cabañas' for 2 and 4 people respectively. Breakfast is served in the cabañas, other meals/picnics are enjoyed out and about on the trials or at the main house. You will be able to relax in very pleasant surroundings and enjoy a good night's sleep. We will ask you in advance for your bed preference: double bed, twin beds, single room...

Meals: After a full day riding, as well as a good lunch (most days not a picnic), it is comforting to know that you can return to delicious and varied meals that reflect the local cuisine. All menus are prepared with completely natural and fresh products of the region. Red meat, fish and wine are especially recommended, but we can easily cater for vegetarians or any other dietary requirements as long as we are warned in advance.

For futher information please contact: rideandes@rideandes.com www.rideandes.com **Climate:** You can expect warm sunny days in the spring and autumn, although we might also get some cooler moments (especially early in the morning or at night) and perhaps a rainy day too. The average temperatures during our main riding seasons (October to mid-December. Mid-February to April) are very pleasant for riding. Mid-December to mid-February, the summer months, can be very hot and the rides (private rides only) are adapted accordingly.

Clothes and Equipment: Travel notes will be sent with useful information including a suggested packing list and guide contact details etc.

Emergencies: In case of accident, our guides will always carry a mobile phone which they will use to contact local assistance. All of the towns along our route count on a medical emergency service.

Health Services: In general, public sanitation and health care in Uruguay are very good. In the event of illness or accident during your stay, you should be prepared to pay for assistance. Upon return home you can submit a claim for reimbursement according to the specifications of your insurance policy. Visa and Master card are credit cards commonly accepted.

Safety: Always ranked at the top in the surveys "most livable and greenest country" in the world, Uruguay is ranked highest in Latin America on the Global Peace Index. Risk of disease is minimal in the areas we visit. Although petty theft can be an issue in the capital, while accompanied by your guide you are in good hands. As with every large city in the world there are a few common-sense rules to follow.

Important Notes

- Booking will be confirmed upon receipt of the corresponding deposit (A 30% non-refundable payment will be required upon confirmation and balance of payment will be required no later than 45 days before beginning of the tour).
- Exceptional postponement/cancellation policy in place due to circumstances directly related to Covid-19, please request full details.
- We reserve the right to alter the itinerary due to circumstances beyond our control.
- Prices can alter without prior notice (preceding a confirmed booking)
- Appropriate medical insurance is mandatory and the responsibility of each guest/booking agent.
